The weather seems to have got the memo that we are approaching summer! Let's hope we have a few more sunny days, especially as so many families are organising special family events for Communions and Confirmations (my youngest daughter's Confirmation is next weekend, so hoping the rain stays away).

As we head into the warmer months, I want to mention a few matters regarding sun safety and hydration. Firstly, please ensure your child applies sunscreen before coming to school. Protecting their skin from the sun's rays makes a big difference in preventing sunburn and long-term damage. Secondly, please ensure your child has a refillable water bottle in school. Staying hydrated is essential, especially during hot weather. Additionally, I recommend that your child has a sun hat which covers their head, neck, and ears. This will offer extra protection from the sun's heat and help prevent heat-related issues.

May is the month of Our Lady – For the last two weeks of term, we invite each class from Year 2 upwards to lead the Rosary each morning. When it is your child's turn, they are asked to come to the front of the school for 8.50am – parents/carers very welcome too.
