Dear Parents

This week started off in an interesting way, with an Ofsted inspector telephoning to say he would be visiting us on Tuesday and Wednesday. Thank you to so many of you who completed a parental questionnaire. The inspector, Karim Ismail, spent a lot of time in lessons, particularly Reception, Years 1, 2, 5 and 6 and playtime talking with children. In addition, he looked at children's work and spoke to children, some parents, staff and governors. This was an ungraded inspection which means Karim could not change the rating of the school, he could only confirm if it was still good (or not). Tuesday started off in another interesting way with no gas in the kitchen to cook food, a broken photocopier with a part that needed ordering and a broken SMART board in Class 2Y. Despite the various challenges, we made it through the week and look forward to reading the inspector's report (likely to be after the half term holiday).

Show Racism the red card – Today in assembly, I explained to the children they should "love the skin they're in". We are all part of one race, the human race and we must celebrate our uniqueness. I showed a video to the children which explained the power of words. If you say something unkind you can't take it back – it's like squeezing toothpaste out of the tube – it won't go back in. Other Assemblies this week – On Tuesday, Miss Allen led her first Infant Assembly (watched by the inspector!) She shared how she had felt starting as a new teacher not knowing anyone and how she has now made some friends. She read a lovely story to the children which you can hear <u>here</u> and challenged all the children to try and make one new friend that day.

On Wednesday, Mrs Tottle-Nugent read "Into the Forest" to the Juniors, by one of her favourite authors, Anthony Browne. Children were encouraged to use other authors' ideas and put a twist in of their own to be successful authors themselves!

The payment can be found on ParentPay. Last year we were able to upgrade all our fuse boxes and install air conditioning in the main hall and several classrooms.
