Dear Parents,

Welcome to the end of another week and another newsletter. I have a lot of "thank yous" to make. Thank you to many of you who bought books from Anne at Usborne books. We raised £592.82 in commission which will be used to buy books for the school! My final thank you is to all the staff at school who spent several evenings this week talking to you all about the progress of your children. It's no easy thing to teach all day, then spend several hours talking to parent after parent and then come in the next day smiling and repeat it all over again! They all deserve a well earned rest this weekend! Mrs Borrett's parents' evening times will be rescheduled as soon as she is back at school (hopefully Monday). Monday's Assembly - On Monday, there was lots to talk about: first of all, Remembrance Sunday which many children had marked in parades if they were in the Brownies/Beavers/Cubs.
