Road Safety – Nationally it is Road Safety Awareness week and so on Tuesday and then Wednesday I spoke to the infants and juniors separately about being road safety aware. Things to note when crossing the road: stop, look, listen, think! Other critical things are: wearing a helmet when cycling or scooting, wearing bright colours on dark evenings so you can be seen and being very careful on roads where there is LOW traffic, not NO TRAFFIC! The infants enjoyed listening to this song and all the children watched this safety video. If you are on your phone while crossing the road, your child may remind you to put it away. You have been warned!
